Notice of Evaluation of CPI Grant Applications

Funding of any application is subject to the amount of federal coastal zone management funds awarded to the FCMP and the amount allocated to the CPI by the Office of Resilience and Coastal Protection (RCP). The final decision whether or not to

fund these projects is expected to be made by NOAA by summer of 2021. Should additional existing funds be identified prior to the FY22 Request for CPI applications, RCP will seek to fund the next highest ranked project(s). Any person whose substantial interests are affected may request a hearing pursuant to Section 120.569, Florida Statutes, within 21 days of publication of this notice. Failure to request a hearing within the period shall constitute a waiver of the right to a hearing.  CITY OF DAYTONA BEACH
 The Florida Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) has determined that City of Daytona Beach’s project involving Ozone System replacement, Lime System upgrade and construction of a new 5 million gallon potable water ground storage tank and high service pump station is not expected to generate controversy over potential environmental effects. The estimated construction cost is \$19,445,000. The project may qualify for a Drinking Water SRF loan composed of federal and state funds. DEP will consider public comments about the environmental impacts of the proposed projects that are postmarked or delivered at the address below within 30 days of this notice.
