The Northwest Florida Water Management District (District) has developed a draft Regional Mitigation Plan in support of the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) to identify mitigation for state road projects with unavoidable wetland impacts. The District provides mitigation options in accordance with Section 373.4137, Florida Statutes, only where use of private mitigation banks is deemed not feasible by State and Federal permitting agencies. Funding of any application is subject to the amount of federal coastal zone management funds awarded to the FCMP and the amount allocated to the CPI by the Office of Resilience and Coastal Protection (RCP). The final decision whether or not to fund these projects is expected to be made by NOAA by summer of 2022. Should additional existing funds be identified prior to the FY23 Request for CPI applications, RCP will seek to fund the next highest ranked project(s). Any person whose substantial interests are affected by the Department's action may petition for an administrative proceeding (hearing) under Sections 120.569 and 120.57, F.S. Any petition for an administrative proceeding must meet the requirements of Rule 28-106.201, F.A.C., and be filed (received by the Clerk) in the Office of General Counsel of the Department at 3900 Commonwealth Blvd, MS35, Tallahassee, FL 32399 or agency_clerk@floridadep.gov, within 21 days of publication of this notice. Failure to file a petition within the time period shall

constitute a waiver of that person's right to request an administrative determination, or to intervene in this proceeding and participate as a party to it.
