ITEM 6:

Consider a request to remove approximately 1.27 acres from the boundary of the Bombing Range Ridge Florida Forever Project.

LOCATION:

Polk County

DSL STAFF REMARKS:

Christopher Rocheford was granted one lot totaling 1.27 acres in Polk County via Quitclaim Deed on March 15, 2017. The land had been included in the design of the Bombing Range Ridge Florida Forever project. The owner submitted a certified letter to DSL requesting removal of their property from the project. The property contains no improvements and supports disturbed dry prairie that may function as semi-improved pasture. A narrow unpaved road separates the tract from the adjacent wetland and many off-road vehicle tracks are conspicuous in aerial photography.

The Bombing Range Ridge project was added to the Conservation and Recreation Lands priority list in 1998. The purpose of the project is to protect a corridor of flatwoods, marshes, swamps, hammocks, and scrub that connects Avon Park Air Force Range, with adjacent state-owned conservation lands. The project currently includes 46,221 acres of which 28,480 remain to be acquired. The Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission and the Florida Forest Service manage the project except for 540 acres adjacent to Rosalie Creek that is managed by the Division of Recreation and Parks. The South Florida Water Management District, The Nature Conservancy, United States Air Force, and Polk County have acquired and manage lands that are within or adjacent to the project boundary.

Pursuant to Rule 18-24.005(5)(a) and 18-24.007(2), F. A. C., ARC shall delete property from a Florida Forever project boundary if a landowner requests to do so by a certified letter. ARC may recommend that the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund (BOT) add such property back into the project boundary, if appropriate. Pursuant to Section 259.105(7)(b)2, Florida Statutes, the BOT has the option of adding this property back into the project boundary if the BOT determines that the property is critical to achieve the purposes of the project.

Subject: Proposed boundary modification (deletion) to Bombing Range Ridge Florida

Forever BOT Project – Rocheford property, Polk County

The Goal of the Bombing Range Ridge (BRR) Florida Forever Project is to conserve and protect significant and dwindling habitat for native species characteristic of Florida's heartland. A secondary goal is to enhance natural-resource based recreation, including adding to the Florida National Scenic Trail system. The Rocheford property proposed for deletion is situated near the southern end of BRR ca. 95 m east of its border with Avon Park Air Force Range. Relative to the project, the property is very small, ca. 1.5 acres (roughly a 100 m x 50 m rectangle).

The parcel, which lies immediately south of an isolated wetland (depression marsh), supports disturbed dry prairie that may function as semi-improved pasture. A narrow unpaved road separates the tract from the depression marsh. Many off-road vehicle tracks are conspicuous in aerial photography.

FNAI has no specific rare species records for the property, although some species, such as Florida sandhill crane, may potentially forage there.

As summarized in the accompanying Florida Forever Measures Evaluation (FFME), the tract contributes to Ecological Greenways, Under-represented Natural Communities, Surface Water Protection, and Aquifer Recharge. However, because of its very small size, these contributions are minimal.




