## Introduction - Purpose

In 2016, the Water Infrastructure Improvements for the Nation (WIIN) Act was passed. The WIIN Act provides for state coal combustion residuals (CCR) permit programs. States may, but are not required to, develop and submit a CCR permit ("or other system of prior approval") program to EPA for approval. In States that do not have an approved permit program ("non-participating States"), EPA must implement a permit program, "subject to the availability of appropriations specifically provided to carry out a program...".

To provide the public and the regulated community with regulatory certainty and consistency for CCR units, the Division of Waste Management is currently in rule development to create two new rules which will adopt the requirements in 40 CFR Part 257.50 through 257.107, "Standards for the Disposal of Coal Combustion Residuals in Landfills and Surface Impoundments" into Chapter 62-701 Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.), and establish the procedures by which Coal Combustion Residuals permits will be issued to facilities in Florida that are currently required to comply with the requirements in 40 CFR Part 257.50 through 257.107.

62-701.804 Standards for the Disposal of Coal Combustion Residuals in Landfills and Surface Impoundments

 62-701.804 – adopts by reference the scope and purpose contained in 40 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) 257.50 and 40 CFR 257.52 revised as of August 5, 2016



**62-701.805 Coal Combustion Residuals Facility Permitting Requirements and Procedures** 

 62-701.805 – Establishes a permit process specific to CCR landfills and CCR surface impoundments



62-701.900 Forms

# Remaining Steps in Rulemaking Process

#### Fast Track Rule Adoption Timeline: Rule 62.701.804, F.A.C

- 1. Rule Development Workshop/Public Meeting June 26, 2020
  - Comment Period: Two weeks, ends on July 13, 2020
- 2. Approval by Secretary to file rule package
- 3. Publish Notice of Intent to Adopt a Rule
  - 14 days to file an objection with ERC
  - 21 days to file written comments with DEP
- 4. File rule package with Joint Administrative Procedures Committee
- 5. File Rule for Adoption no more than 90 days after Notice of Proposed Rule. Earliest: Effective Date should coordinate with 62-701.805 [Since this is fast track rule can go into effect immediately, or on date of choice]



# Remaining Steps in Rulemaking Process

## ERC Adoption Rule Timeline for 62-701.220, 310, 805, and 900, F.A.C.

- 1. Rule Development Workshop/Public Meeting: June 26, 2020
  - Comment Period: 2 weeks, ends on July 13, 2020
- 2. Approval by Secretary to file rule package
- 3. Publish Notice of Proposed Rule (NOPR)
  - Must file rule challenge within 21 days of NOPR
  - 21 days to propose Lower Cost Regulatory Alternative
- 4. File package with Joint Administrative Procedures Committee
- 5. Publish ERC Meeting date in Florida Administrative Record (FAR)
- 6. ERC Meeting targeting September 30, 2020 or October 28, 2020
  - Must file rule challenge within 10 days after ERC hearing



# Remaining Steps in Rulemaking Process

#### ERC Adoption Rule Timeline for 62-701.805, F.A.C. (cont'd)

<u>File Certification Package</u>: No less than 14 days after the ERC hearing or more than 45 days after adjournment of the final hearing on the rule, 21 days after material authorized to be submitted at the hearing, or 21 days after receipt of the transcript, if one is made, whichever is latest. Rule will be effective 20 days after submission.

#### **EPA Approval**

Concurrent with the rulemaking process DEP will develop and submit an application package to EPA for CCR Permit program approval.
