Pelican Bay Use Area

- Replace dock pilings
 Extend/add boat slips on dock
 Install boat moorings
 Construct visitor center

Gulf Beach Use Area

- Construct a row of small picnic pavilions
- Replace restroom

Camping Area

- Renovate/replace cabins
- Replace restrooms

- Enhance landscape
 - Develop a group camping area

Landbase at Jug Creek Marina

• Architectural preservation study of cottages for renovations/improvements

Tram Road

- Repair/stabilize park road for visitor access
- Provide wayfinding/interpretation

Support Facilities

- Renovate support dock/add boathouse
- Relocate shop
