Approved Analytical Methods











For DEP Rules:

Data submitted for regulatory use requires analytical methods approved by DEP

- Methods or method lists (sources) specified in rules
 - Includes methods cited in any order or permit, if applicable
- Methods "recognized" by DEP but not cited in rules
 - As described in the QA Rule
- Alternative, new or modified methods must be approved by DEP, if applicable per QA Rule













Methods Promulgated by Rule (F.A.C)

EXAMPLES

Drinking Water

Includes citations to federal rules at 40 CFR Parts 141 & 143 (see 62-550)

Wastewater

Includes citations to federal rules at 40 CFR Part 136 (see 62-620)

Waste

References and tables in waste management rules (see 62-780)

Bioassessment

 QA Rule citations for DEP SOP bioassessment laboratory procedures (see 62-160)













Methods Specified or Recognized by DEP

- Remember: A method for the analyte and matrix already specified in a rule, permit, order or contract must be used
 - A DEP program may have the discretion to allow methods other than those specified as above:
 - To accommodate obsolete rule listings
 - To achieve DQOs with technology or method improvements
 - To apply more stringent requirements
 - NOTE: Alternative or new method approval may be required if methods specified in rules will not be used
- The method must be published and intended for the analyte and matrix to be analyzed













Methods Specified or Recognized by DEP (con't)

 - 1. Table FS 1000-5 (Specific methods not listed at 40 CFR Part 136)
 - 2. DEP SOPs BRN 1000, LQ 1000, LT 7000, LVI 1000 & SCI 1000 (Bioassessment lab procedures)
- Method lists associated with DEP Rules
 - 62-4.246(4) Target MDL & PQL list

Choosing Appropriate Methods for Use

- Rule or other specifications take precedence
- Matrix & analyte must be specific to method
- Sensitivity MDL & PQL
 - See 62-4.246(4) and Waste Management targets
 - Methods may also suggest expected sensitivities
- Potential analytical interferences
 - Described in published methods













Choosing Appropriate Methods

- Equivalent methods & technology
 - See MDL & PQL target lists (DEP)
 - See 40 CFR Parts 136, 141, 143 lists
 - See DOH lab certification application list
 - http://www.dep.state.fl.us/labs/dohforms.htm













Choosing Appropriate Methods

- Lab must be certified for method (62-160 FAC)
 - Non-potable water equivalency provision
 - Certification only required for one analyte-analytical technology combination
 - Lab may <u>report</u> any method for equivalent combination
 - Lab must meet requirements in reported method
 - Specific QA rule exceptions are described:
 - DEP program may waive certification
 - Certain tests and applications are exempted

Modified, New & Alternative Methods

- New methods
 - No DEP-approved method is specified, approved or recognized for the analyte & matrix
- Alternative methods-
 - DEP specifies, approves or recognizes a method for the analyte & matrix which is different than the proposed alternative method
- Modified Methods-
 - Details in a published method have been modified by the lab
 - No pre-approval by DEP required if any of these options are applicable:
 - Method language specifically allows modification
 - 40 CFR Part 136.6 modification allowances apply
 - The method is an SW-846 method and is modified per QA rule provisions
 - Lab documentation of performance using the modified method is required in all cases













Modified, New & Alternative Methods (con't)

- If validation information must be submitted per QA Rule requirements-
 - Method validation per DEP-QA-001/01
 - For NPDES application per 40 CFR 136.4 & .5
 - DEP will determine if allowed modifications without pre-approval per 40 CFR Part 136.6 apply
 - DEP will forward submittal to EPA Region IV
- Approval-
 - DEP will issue order to approve or deny
 - Site-specific or limited use notice in Quality of Science enewsletter
 - Statewide use notice in Florida Administrative Register
 - NPDES EPA Region IV will approve or deny
