






What is the BMA?

- Section 403.0752, F.S.
- BMA Stakeholder Process
- Regional Permit Document
 - Better method of beach management
 - Regulatory requirements must be met
 - Streamlined
 - Perpetual, adaptable, amendable
 - Increased coordination

• 2 Goals:


- Satisfy regulatory requirements
