Cleanup of Legally Applied Pesticides

- 1. Former agricultural land and other large parcels may have residual pesticides or herbicides from historical use
- 2. Often questions about how to deal with such residues during re-development
- 3. Common to request some form of acknowledgement from DEP that risks have been addressed.
- 4. A Site Rehabilitation Completion Order is not always the desired
 - a. Chapter 62-780 doesn't provide any other endpoint
 - b. 62-780 process is the only way to get to an SRCO
- 5. "Pesticide Exemption" in Florida law frequently misunderstood
- 6. Applies to pesticides in place and any action the department takes to address the contamination
- 7. Does not offer blanket release of liability
- 8. Once soil (or groundwater) with residual pesticides is disturbed, moving such soil (or water) to another location is not covered under "legal application"
