
In accordance with 40 C.F.R. 51.103, the Florida Department of Environmental Protection requests approval of a proposed revision to Florida's State Implementation Plan (SIP) addressing certain infrastructure requirements addressing the implementation of the 2010 revised National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) for Sulfur Dioxide (SO₂).

This SIP submittal proposes to revise Florida's June 3, 2013 Infrastructure SIP submittal for the 2010 Revised National Ambient Air Quality Standard for Sulfur Dioxide (SO₂). This SIP submission is solely meant to address the CAA Section 110(a)(2)(D)(i)(I) prongs 1 and 2 infrastructure elements that the Department, pursuant to EPA guidance, did not complete in its previous submittal.

A notice of hearing was published in the Florida Administrative Register on August 3, 2018, and a hearing, if requested, was to be held on September 6, 2018. No hearing was requested and no hearing was held.
