Hello, I'd like to provide a comment about the Hillsborough River State Park 10-year management plan.

Nine-banded armadillos are mentioned in the management plan as a problem species, similar to feral hogs and the plan recommends their removal. I strongly disagree with this approach as armadillos naturally expanded their distribution and were not aided by humans in this expansion, unlike feral hogs. Feral hogs are also much more destructive than armadillos and removal efforts should focus on this species, as they not only decimate arthropod communities as mentioned in the plan but also predate on native listed herpetofauna species such as juvenile gopher tortoises, tortoise and turtle eggs, and numerous amphibian species, including gopher frogs. I recommend removing the paragraph in the plan that addresses the removal of armadillos from the park.

Also, on page A 5-22, the green iguana is included in the species list but is not recognized with an asterisk as non-native.

Improvements

The following developments/improvements are proposed for the updated Hillsborough River State Park management plan:

- Add a Pole Barn, Clivus Restroom, and Safe Crossing of US 301 to the Fort Foster Property
- Add a Pole Barn, Pave Roads in Shop Area, and Add Solar Panels on the Shop Roof
- Upgrade Restrooms, Restore CCC Pavilion, Repair Seawall, and Add Accessible Canoe Kayak Floating Dock to the Picnic Area
- · Renovate and Repair Stationary Bridge
- Add Interpretation and Erosion Control on the Seminole Trail
- Renovate Campsites, Replace 2 Bathhouses, and Pave Campground Access and Loop Road
- Stabilize the Shoreline and Repair Seawall at Cedar Landing
- Install Solar Panels in the Old Sprayfield
- Add Restroom, Interpretive Kiosk to the Old Fort King Trailhead
- Restore Model Dairy Property
- Move CCC Cabin to Parking Lot #1 for Interpretation
