Lignumvitae Key Aquatic Preserve covers 7,000 acres of submerged lands with a huge diversity of important species and habitats. Caribbean spiny lobster, stone crab and other species support critical commercial industries and livelihoods. A paradise for bonefish and tarpon anglers, the area also provides beautiful coastlines and opportunities for exploring the mangrove islands.

Our paradise becomes less lovely with each derelict lobster trap and every fishing line, can, bottle, food wrapper and plastic bag dropped in our water and tossed upon our shores. Marine debris and coastal trash can be a hazard to navigation, decrease value

of landscapes and be deadly to marine life. The Florida Department of Environmental Protection, with funding from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, intends to address the problem. **WE NEED YOUR HELP.**
