## **Air Pollution Advisory**

The Environmental Protection Commission of Hillsborough County is issuing an Air Pollution Advisory due to elevated levels of <u>Particulate Matter of 2.5 micrometers or less.</u> This advisory is effective <u>immediately</u>, today 10/3/2023. We are experiencing elevated levels of PM2.5 in Hillsborough County and expect levels to reach the Unhealthy for Sensitive Groups Air Quality Index range.

Particulate Matter (PM) is one of the US EPA Criteria Air Pollutants and has an established National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) based on health criteria. Particulate matter is the term for a mixture of solid particles and liquid droplets found in the air. Particulate matter can be defined as PM10 which are inhalable particles of 10 micrometers and smaller or PM2.5 which are inhalable particles of 2.5 micrometers and smaller. Particulate matter can be emitted directly from a source (construction sites, unpaved roads, fires, etc.) or can form in the atmosphere as a result of complex reactions of chemicals such as sulfur dioxide and nitrogen oxides.
