PRP ATC Assignment Process

A prior ATC assignment shall be considered for issuance of a Purchase Order for continued site rehabilitation for a period of up to 3 years from the receipt date of the Final Deliverable for the LSA Purchase Order.

Certified Deliverables

All deliverables under the Agency Term Contract must be submitted electronically to the Site Manager. Paper copies are not required unless the deliverable includes a Professional Engineer (PE) or Professional Geologist (PG) signature and/or seal that does not meet the requirements for electronic or digitally-affixed signatures pursuant to Chapters 61G15 or 61G16, Florida Administrative Code, as applicable.

<u>Technical Protocol for Evaluating Natural Attenuation Parameters at Sites with Petroleum Contaminated Groundwater</u>, posted January 2018 under PRP Quick Link "Remediation Guidance".

Q: How does acceptance of SRFA Agreement sites affect new assignments?

A: SRFA projects do not count as an "award" from the Contractor Selection Formula batch, but they do count as an assignment under the CSF formula, and as a closure under the CSF for the CLPRank (Closure Percentage Rank) and can affect future formula ranking.

Q: Is fuel for diesel equipment included in the price for equipment?

A: Clarification was provided in QA for the ITN: fuel is considered to be <u>included</u> wherever applicable in all pay items *except* those in Short Term/Episodic System Operation packages (Section 16.B) and Remedial Action Equipment/ System Use (Section 18), which specifically exclude utilities (electricity, propane & sewer may be paid as reimbursable items, if not paid by DEP directly). Thus, fuel may also be added as a reimbursable cost in Sections 16.B and 18.

Q: Are "as-built" drawings (pay item 19-18) allowed in conjunction with initial system start-up?

A: As-Built or Red-lined drawings are a part of Item 19-19, Initial System Start-up Report, and are scoped as item 19-18 only when related to an activity that is **not** an initial start-up. The PE review of as-built drawings (21-29) may be scoped with either item 19-18 or 19-19. Construction drawings must have been prepared prior to the preparation of as-built drawings.
