

When In Doubt...Call It In!



When to Call

24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year



- Must Report with 24 Hours
- Hazardous Material releases of Reportable Quantities
- Any petroleum discharge to surface waters
- Petroleum ≥ 25 gallons on pervious surfaces
- Spills requiring State/Federal Notification or Assistance
- Etc....





When You Call...What Do We Need? Our Response is Only As Good as the Information Provided.

- Who...is responsible for the release?
- What...(and how much) material was involved?
- What...is impacted and is being done to mitigate?
 - Where...is the location of the release?
 - When...did the release take place?
 - Why...you should provide call back information?






