



What's New on Florida's River Trails

August: 2024

Due to Hurricane Debby, Myakka River State Park in southwest Florida is closed along with the Suwannee River Wilderness Trail. Check the Florida State Parks [Storm Updates page](#) for the latest information.

July: 2024

Our newest designated paddling trail is the 76.5-mile Kissimmee River Blueway! Maps and information about paddling and camping along the river at one of several new campsites has been added to the paddling webpage.

June: 2024

The Aucilla River around mile 3 of the designated trail has a large blockage from downed trees.

December: 2023

Upriver sections above Paynes Creek Historic State Park may still have some blockages from Hurricane Ian, depending on water levels. Check with local outfitters before embarking.

Due to damage from Hurricane Idalia, the Holton Creek and Dowling Park River Camps along the Suwannee River Wilderness Trail remain closed. Check the [trail website](#) for the latest updates.

June: 2023

The St. Johns River Blueway Paddling Guide and Data Book has been updated. At river mile 23.5, the Crowne Plaza Jacksonville is now the DoubleTree by Hilton.

May: 2023

Renovation of the boat ramp/launch along the Wakulla River at U.S. 98 is complete and is now open for public use.

A paddler reported a log jam/pullover on the Perdido River about 6.3 miles upriver from the Wilson B. Robertson Canoe Launch at U.S. 90.
